

## CARROLL COUNTY COMMISSION ON AGING

The General Assembly of Maryland created a State Commission on Aging by House Bill 1, Laws of Maryland, 1959. The County Commissioners of Carroll County adopted Resolution 19-72 on October 10, 1972 setting up the Commission on Aging for Carroll County.

Members of the Carroll County Commission on Aging will be appointed by the County Commissioners and will serve for a period of three (3) years without compensation. Members shall be eligible for reappointment with a two-term limit. A vacancy shall be filled by the County Commissioners for the unexpired term. In addition to the specific designations noted, 50% of the membership must be 60 years of age or older.
