

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS
CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND
MINUTES**

On October 12, 2011, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, David Grayson and Robert Tabler were present as well as John Scruggs, Counsel to the Board; and Nancy David.

10:00 a.m. to 10:55 a.m., Case 5613, Application of Steven Tiedemann for the use of GT Westminster, LLC, for the transfer of the existing Class BC – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Lilia Kai Poldmae and Edward S. Treadwell for the use of Westminster Greene Turtle, LLC, t/a The Greene Turtle Sports Bar and Grille, 830 Market Street, Westminster, in Election District 7. The Board approved the application as presented upon a motion of Mr. Grayson and seconded by Mr. Tabler, Vote 3 – 0.

11:05 a.m. to 11:25 a.m., Case 5614, Application of David Scranton to replace Richard Tumsuden on the existing Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Richard Tumsuden and Jay Laurienzo for the use of Laurienzo Restaurants, Inc., t/a Laurienzo Brick Oven Cafe, 114 S. Main Street, Mt. Airy, in Election District 13. The Board approved the application as presented upon a motion of Mr. Grayson and seconded by Mr. Tabler, Vote 3 – 0.

12:00 p.m. to 12:55 p.m., Case 5616, Class A – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to John L. Hunt and Richard J. Hunt for the use of Titanium Legs, LLC, t/a Stubby’s Main Course, 2825 Baltimore Blvd., Finksburg – Violation Hearing (Rule #7 – Illegal Conduct and Rule #56 – Consumption of Alcohol While Working). The Board found the Licensee John Hunt (Richard Hunt was not at the hearing) guilty of both charges and issued a fine of \$500.00 for the violation of Rule #56 and a fine of \$100.00 for the violation of Rule #7, payable within 30 days of the written decision.

1:00 p.m. to 1:40 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the September 14, 2011, meeting of the Board was approved upon a motion of Mr. Grayson and seconded by Mr. Tabler.
2. Inspector Kaizer reported and presented photos of the completed outdoor area at the United Coon Hunter’s Association clubhouse. The project had been approved by the Board several months ago but was just recently completed.
3. A letter from Jay Laurienzo, of Laurienzo’s Brick Oven Café, requesting permission to open Monday evenings for special football viewing events, was presented and approved by the Board.
4. Copies of Respondent’s Memorandum of Law, concerning Rafael’s pending court case, was distributed to the Board. Attorney Scruggs informed the Board of the status of this case. The Board ordered that no action on pending complaints should be taken until the final decision of the court case.
5. A letter and drawings from Christine Liberatore, of Liberatore’s Ristorante, requesting permission

to construct an outdoor patio area and to serve alcoholic beverages in the proposed area, was presented and approved by the Board.

6. Two letters from Vince Dell, of the Westminster American Legion Post #31, informing the Board of a change in their hours of operation and a listing of outdoor events for 2012 were presented and approved.
7. An e-mail from Patrice Campitelli, of Wine Me Up, informing the Board of a change in her hours and days of operation were presented and approved.
8. Copies of the tentative hearing schedule for 2012 were distributed to all Board members.
