

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS  
CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND  
MINUTES**

**On December 14, 2011, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, David Grayson and Robert Tabler were present as well as Jon Scruggs, Counsel to the Board; and Nancy David.**

**10:05 a.m. to 10:45 a.m.,** Case 5619, Application of Habib M. Rahimi and Kim M. Rahimi for a Class B – Beer & Wine License for the use of Bagel Café, Inc., t/a Habib’s Kabob, 1720 Liberty Road, A&B, Eldersburg, in Election District 5. Upon motion of Mr. Grayson, seconded by Mr. Tabler, the Board found the Applicants to be fit and proper persons and approved the application based upon quarterly food sales reports being filed, all required inspections to be completed, and all employees serving alcoholic beverages be certified by a state authorized entity.

**11:00 a.m. to 12:10 p.m.,** Application of John Furbay and Roula Sakellis for a Class B – Beer, Wine & Liquor License for the use of Karpathoes, Inc., t/a Fratelli’s Italian & Seafood Restaurant, 2315 A-B Hanover Pike, Hampstead, in Election District 8. Upon motion of Mr. Grayson, seconded by Mr. Tabler, the Board found the Applicants to be fit and proper persons and approved the application based upon quarterly food sales reports being filed, all required inspections to be completed, and certification of attendance at a state authorized entity providing alcohol awareness training. The Liquor Inspector has to make a final site visit prior to opening for business.

1. The minutes from the November 9, 2011, meeting of the Board was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Meerdter.

5. A fax from Todd Bricken, of Brick Ridge, requesting permission to close for 11 days from January 1 to January 12, was presented and approved by the Board.
6. A letter from John Packard, informing the Board of abandoned inventory at the former Wine Country, was presented and explained by Inspector Kaizer.
7. The Board was informed by Attorney Scruggs that no ruling has been issued by Circuit Court on the Rafael’s case.
