

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS  
CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND  
MINUTES**

**On July 11, 2012, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, Chairman and Robert Tabler were present as well as Assistant County Attorney Tim Dixon, Counsel to the Board; and Nancy David. David Grayson's term expired June 30 and a replacement had not been appointed in time for this meeting.**

**10:00 a.m. to 10:20 a.m.,** Case 5650, Class B – Beer and Light Wine License issued to Greg Hendrickson for the use of Stead, Inc., t/a Pizza Hut, 761 Hanover Pike, Hampstead – Violation Hearing (Rule #24 - Responsible Person in Charge When Open)

The Board found the Licensee guilty and issued a fine of \$200.00, payable within 30 days of the written decision.

**10:30 a.m. to 10:55 a.m.,** Case 5651, Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Miia Illiano for the use of Mt. Airy Greene Turtle, LLC, t/a The Greene Turtle, 1604 Ridgeside Drive, Mt. Airy – Violation Hearing (Rule #14 – Alteration, Addition, Remodeling)

The Board found the Licensee guilty and issued a fine of \$100.00, payable within 30 days of the written decision.

**11:00 a.m.,** Case 5652, Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Anthony Steven Sabol for the use of Nadia, Inc., t/a La Fiesta Mexican Restaurant, 1211 Liberty Road, Eldersburg – Violation Hearing (Rule #11 – Temporary Closing) - POSTPONED

The Board received and granted a request for postponement on this case. The case will be scheduled for August 22, 2012.

11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the June 13, 2012, meeting of the Board was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Meerdter.
2. Kevin Atticks and Jade Ostner, of the Maryland Wineries Association, appeared before the Board to present a plan for collecting Maryland Wine Festival applications. After their presentation the Board decided not to make any changes to the current procedures in place. Chairman Meerdter informed them he does not have the authority to allow another entity to handle funds for the Liquor Board.
3. Max Sweet, part-owner of New York J&P/Westminster, appeared before the Board to request a name change to VCP (Vanessa's Corner Pub) effective immediately. Several communications had been received on this issue and the Board requested clarity since signage on and around the establishment reflect different names. The Board approved the request to use VCP and a revised liquor license will be prepared when the existing license is brought into the office. Mr. Sweet also mentioned the possibility of an outdoor Bike Show on the parking lot and will forward information as it becomes available.
4. One-day liquor license applications (3) from the Knights of Columbus at the Farm Museum on July 21, The Ecuadent Foundation at Bellendene Vineyard on August 11 and the Forest & Stream Club at the Forest & Stream Club on August 4, for outdoor events were presented and approved by the Board.

5. A letter from Robert Browning, of the V.F.W./Mt. Airy, informing the Board of a change in the hours of operation was presented and will be retained in their file.
6. A letter from Somsak Chanyasulkit, of Gary & Dell's Crabhouse, requesting permission from the Board for their annual closing on December 25 – February 12, was presented and approved by the Board.
7. A letter from Stephanie Heck, Sykesville American Legion, requesting permission to serve alcoholic beverages for an outdoor event in the pavilion/parking area on July 21, was presented and approved by the Board.
8. A letter and drawing from Scott McGee, of Lineboro Village Inn, requesting permission to serve alcoholic beverages for three outdoor events on July 22, August 18, September 16, were presented and approved by the Board.
9. An application for a catering supplement to be added to the existing Class B- BWL license for Bud's at Silver Run was presented and approved by the Board. The additional fee of \$250.00 will be paid and revised license reflecting this upgrade will be prepared when the current license is brought into the office.
10. The Class D –B&W liquor license for 1311 Beer and Wine was surrendered on July 9 as that establishment has closed for business. A Bulk Transfer Permit has been received to move the remaining inventory to the Mt. Airy Inn.
