

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS

MINUTES**

**On January 4, 2013, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, Chairman, Robert Tabler and David Brauning were present as well as Assistant County Attorney Tim Dixon, Counsel to the Board; and Nancy David.**

**10:05 a.m. to 10:38 a.m.,** Case 5687, Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to David Scranton and Jay Laurienzo for the use of Laurienzo Restaurants, Inc., t/a Laurienzo Brick Oven Café, 114 S. Main Street, Mt. Airy – Violation Hearing (Rule #7/Illegal Conduct – Operating without a Current Business License). The Board found a violation had occurred and issued a fine of \$50.00.

**10:40 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., Case 5685,** Application of Patrick Larson to replace the resident Licensee on the existing Class A – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Minish V. Patel and Ashish C. Parikh for the use of Shreenth Associates, LLC, t/a Cranberry Liquors, 405 N. Center Street, Westminster, in Election District 7. The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application as presented.

**11:15 a.m. to 12:05 p.m., Case 5686,** Application of Stacy S. Hurley for a Class B – Beer and Light Wine License for the use of Hurley Enterprises, LLC, t/a Cryin’ Johnnies, 235 S. Main Street, Mt. Airy, in Election District 13. The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application as presented.

12:10 p.m. to 1:00 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the December 12, 2012, meeting of the Board was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Brauning.
2. The Board was informed of the closing of the Frisco Family Pub. The liquor license was surrendered on December 20.
3. Inspector Kaizer presented a letter from Tim Brandenburg, of Crossroads Inn, informing the Board that the business will close on January 6 and requesting the Board hold the liquor license active until the other licensee, John Randall Shorb, who is currently out of state, decides if he wants to keep the business active without Mr. Brandenburg’s participation. Upon motion of Mr. Brauning, seconded by Mr. Tabler, the Board agreed to hold the license for 30 days, pending Mr. Shorb’s decision.
4. The County Commissioners have scheduled a meeting on January 10 at 3:30 p.m. to discuss the legislative proposal for fee increases on Class A & D licenses. Chairman Meerdter prepared a letter to the Commissioners for all members to sign outlining the background on the fee increase and informing the Board that the legislation is supported by the Licensees. Mr. Brauning and Inspector Kaizer will attend the meeting as the other members will not be available.
