

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS
CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND
MINUTES**

On April 10, 2013, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, Chairman, Robert Tabler and David Brauning were present as well as Attorney Timothy Dixon and Nancy David.

10:05 a.m. to 10:55 a.m., Case 5694, Application of Steven M. VonBussenius and Jamie M. Roden for the use of WMU, LLC, for the transfer of the existing Class D – Beer and Light Wine License issued to Anthony M. Campitelli and Patrice Campitelli for the use of PAC, LLC, t/a Wine Me Up, 61-1/2 East Main Street, Westminster, in Election District 7.

The Board found the applicants to be fit and proper persons and approved the application as presented upon motion of Commissioner Brauning and seconded by Commissioner Tabler. A release from the State Comptroller is pending on payment of taxes.

11:00 a.m. to 11:55 a.m., Case 5695, Application of Kristina M. Malloy, Mark J. O’Leary and J. Gregory Boyland for the use of MGH Group, LLC, t/a Oscar’s Alehouse for the transfer of the existing Class BC – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Ronald B. White and Edward L. Squillario for the use of Four Friends LLC, t/a Cobblestone Tavern and Grille, 1438 Liberty Road, Eldersburg, in Election District 5.

The Board found the applicants to be fit and proper persons and approved the application as presented upon motion of Commissioner Tabler and seconded by Commissioner Brauning. All approvals must be received prior to the license being issued.

12:05 p.m. to 1:00 p.m., Case 5696, Application of Casimir Saintcross, Jr., to replace the Resident Licensee on the existing Class A – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Lawrence P. Cake and Jason D. Cake for the use of Cake’s Liquors, Inc., t/a Crossroads Liquors, 625 Baltimore Blvd., Suite E, Westminster, in Election District 7.

The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application as presented upon motion of Commissioner Brauning and seconded by Commissioner Tabler.

1:05 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the April 10, 2013 meeting of the Board, was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Brauning.
2. Attorney J. Brooks Leahy appeared to inform the Board of a proposed move for the Cork ‘N Bottle package goods store, a Class A-BWL establishment in Mt. Airy. The owner of the property, Mrs. Dorsey, has been approached by a developer that is proposing a shopping center that will provide 3,500-4,500 sq. ft. space for the liquor store so Mr. Lee will continue to operate for the next two years until the new space is complete. The old location will be torn down and a Sheetz store will be built. Mr. Leahy’s client sees this request as an improvement with this concept. This Board also sees this as an improvement and would encourage Mrs. Dorsey to proceed and will show their support of this request.
3. Dave Johansson, of Johansson’s Dining House, appeared at the request of the Board to address the issue of DWI reports (total of 10 for 2012) mentioning his establishment. He informed the Board that his building can seat 617 people at full capacity. He also brought some different

sized glasses and explained the amount of alcohol used in certain drinks. The Board noted that most of the DWI reports are violations in the early morning hours. The Chairman stated the purpose of this meeting was for information only.

4. A request from the Sykesville American Legion to have an outdoor event on April 27 from Noon to 7:00 p.m. was presented and approved by the Board.
5. A letter from Marvin Frush, of the Hampstead American Legion, requesting permission to hold outdoor events in their pavilion on April 27, May 27, August 24 & 25, September 2, September 7, and October 12, was presented and approved by the Board.
6. A letter from Bill Woodward, of the United Coon Hunter's Association, requesting permission to hold an outdoor event on May 11, was presented and approved by the Board.
7. The Board was informed that the total amount of revenue generated from the annual renewal of liquor licenses was \$176,690.
8. Inspector Kaizer informed the Board of age compliance checks recently completed with the City of Westminster. Three sale to minors violations resulted in a check of 13 establishments. He also gave updates on changes to New York J&P/Finksburg and Serra Brothers Italian Deli.
9. Chairman Meerdter shared information with the Board about a phone call from the Permits Dept. regarding wheelchair access when approving outdoor seating areas.
