

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS

MINUTES**

**On June 12, 2013, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, Chairman, Robert Tabler and David Brauning were present as well as County Attorney Timothy Burke and Nancy David.**

**10:05 a.m. to 10:25 a.m., Case 5708**, Application of Jamie R. Sauro to replace the resident licensee on the existing Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Sharleen Kutrumbis for the use of FS Rest LLC, t/a New York J&P Pizza, 6252 Sykesville Road, Eldersburg, in Election District 5.

The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application as presented upon motion of Commissioner Brauning and seconded by Commissioner Tabler.

**10:30 a.m. to 11:10 a.m., Case 5709**, Application of Nicole Andolino for a Class B – Beer and Wine License for the use of The Girls Joint LLC, t/a Le Ragazze Italian Bistro, 250 Englar Road, R10A, Westminster, in Election District 7.

The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application with conditions that all necessary inspections are completed and quarterly food sales vs. alcohol sales reports be submitted for the first year of operation, upon motion of Commissioner Brauning and seconded by Commissioner Tabler.

**11:30 a.m. to 12:20 p.m., Case 5710**, Application of Peter Truby for a Class D – Beer and Wine License for the use of Salazon Chocolate Co., LLC, t/a Salazon Chocolate Co. & Market, 7552 Main Street, Sykesville, in Election District 5.

The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application with the conditions that all necessary inspections are completed, the outstanding tax issue is satisfied prior to the issuance of the liquor license, establishment must be open at least 40 hours per week, and permission from Sykesville for outdoor seating must be obtained, upon motion of Commissioner Tabler and seconded by Commissioner Brauning.

**2:00 p.m. to 2:15 p.m., Case 5704**, Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Rajesh Puri and Michael Dunnigan for the use of JMD Corporation, t/a Casa Rica, 400 North Center Street, Westminster – Violation Hearing (Sale to a Minor)

The Board found the licensees guilty as charged and issued a fine of \$300.00, payable within 30 days of the written decision.

**2:20 p.m. to 2:35 p.m., Case 5705**, Class B – Beer, Wine and Liquor License issued to Robert R. Baldini, Christine M. Kratzke and Alexander D. Obriecht for the use of Ruby Tuesday, Inc., t/a Ruby Tuesday, 210 Malcolm Drive, Westminster – Violation Hearing (Sale to a Minor)

The Board found the licensees guilty as charged and issued a fine of \$300.00, payable within 30 days of the written decision.

2:35 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the May 8, 2013 meeting of the Board, was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Brauning.
2. A letter from Maggie's Restaurant requesting their June discussion of DWI reports be rescheduled to July, due to a scheduled medical procedure, was presented and approved by the Board.

3. A letter from Marvin Frush, of the Hampstead American Legion Post 200, requesting permission to serve alcoholic beverages at an outdoor event in the pavilion on June 29 was presented and approved by the Board.
4. A letter with drawing from Ridia Dearie, of the Cork & Bottle Spirit Shop, requesting permission for an outdoor seating area to accommodate 6 tables with each having 4 chairs, was presented to the Board. Commissioner Tabler made a motion to approve based upon Inspector Kaizer's recommendation, seconded by Commission Brauning. Commissioner Meerdter was opposed.
5. A letter from Kim Byrnes, of The Sideways Café, informing the Board of a change in their days and hours of operation was presented.
6. A fax from Post Manager Stephanie Heck, of the Sykesville American Legion Post 223, requesting permission to serve alcoholic beverages in the Pavilion area for a July 4 picnic, was presented and approved by the Board.
7. A fax from Steven VonBussenius and Jamie Roden, of Wine Me Up, requesting permission to change the t/a name to Artisan Wine Company, was approved upon a motion by Commissioner Tabler, seconded by Commissioner Brauning.
8. A letter and drawings from Stanley Stamidis, The Stables, informing the Board of renovations to the bathrooms was presented and noted by the Board.
9. Inspector Kaizer suggested placing a watermark on the liquor licenses showing the current year. This practice will be implemented with the 2014 license renewal process.
