

**BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS
CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND
MINUTES**

On October 9, 2013, the Board of License Commissioners met in Room 003 of the Carroll County Office Building, 225 North Center Street, Westminster, Maryland 21157. Board members Roland Meerdter, Chairman, Robert Tabler and David Brauning were present as well as Assistant County Attorney Timothy Dixon.

10:00 a.m. to 11:56 a.m., Case 5728, Application of Rachel Jean Louise Brodsky and Hossein Kalarestaghi for a Class B - Beer, Wine and Liquor License for the use of T-Bone & More, LLC., t/a T-Bone & More, 1834 Liberty Road, Eldersburg, in Election District 5.
The Board found the applicant to be a fit and proper person and approved the application.

11:56 a.m. to 12:45 p.m., the Board addressed the following official business:

1. The minutes from the September 11, 2013 meeting of the Board, was approved upon a motion of Mr. Tabler and seconded by Mr. Brauning.
2. Letter and drawing from Cork & Bottle Spirit Shop requesting permission for an outdoor event on October 12th was presented and approved by the Board.
3. Letter requesting removal of Wayne Clarke and adding Richard Watkins to the Sykesville Memorial Post #223 liquor license was presented and approved by the Board.
4. Inspector Kaizer introduced Mr. Michael Ball from Piney Run Liquors; General Manager, who is asking the board to approve his request for a trailer under the existing license to store additional quantities of alcohol. This trailer would be placed right next to the building and measures 20ft x 8ft and has no wheels. Mr. Ball to submit a drawing to the Board since this is a change to the floor plan. The Board approved Mr. Ball's request of a storage trailer.
5. A letter and drawing from Xinyan Zhang, China Inn, informing the Board of an updated floor plan was presented and approved by the Board.
6. Inspector Kaizer updated the Board regarding the remodeling of the work that was done at Paddock Wine & Spirits. A fee was imposed by Permits and Inspections for the work that was completed at the establishment.
7. Inspector Kaizer discussed the 2013 Wine Festival that was held on September 21st and September 22nd. All 40 wineries were in attendance and all licenses were delivered in a timely fashion. At the Premier Tent the Maryland Wine Association held a festival within our festival. Two wines were being served in the Premier Tent and Rule 396 was followed. Mr. Kaizer followed up with the two wineries that were in the Premier Tent. Sheriff's Department was present during the festival.

8. The Board agreed to designate Tim Dixon as the BLC's representative regarding the Open Meetings Act requirement. David Brauning made the motion and Robert Tabler second the motion.
