The meeting was called to order by Chairman Alec Yeo at approximately 6:00 p.m. He welcomed those in attendance to the first Joint County/Municipal Planning Commission Meeting. Thirty-five individuals were in attendance, including representatives from seven of the eight municipalities. Westminster was absent from the meeting. Following introductions, Brenda Dinne presented an update on the Stormwater Remediation Fee legislation that was adopted during the 2015 Maryland General Assembly session. Representatives of the State Highway Administration delivered updates on the County's transportation projects and discussed the Consolidated Transportation Program. The Maryland Department of Planning (MDP) presented an update on legislation from the most recent General Assembly session, including House Bill 919. Melissa Appler from the MDP identified resources and services available to the County and the towns through the MDP. County staff discussed the 2014 Annual Report. They discussed strategies for the 2015 Transportation Priority Letter and provided an update on the 2014 Water and Sewer Master Plan, as well as plan amendments.

There was significant discussion throughout the meeting, and the meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:45 p.m.
