

## **FY 14 Local Management Board Accomplishment Highlights**

- Renamed LMB to Carroll County Local Management Board for Children, Youth and Families
- Developed LMB brochure for marketing in FY 15
- Received the National Association of Counties (NACo) FY 14 Achievement Award for Parent-Child Interaction Therapy, an evidence-based treatment for young children, ages 2-7 years and their caregivers
- Provided start-up funding to implement SMART (assessment and treatment of children prenatally affected by maternal alcohol or substance use)
- Provided mini-grants to assist early childhood programs: materials, audio-screening equipment, training kits and computer tablets
- Sustained funding for LMB functions through an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Department of Human Resources/Department of Social Services
- Developed Request for Proposal for Interagency Family Preservation and through County bid process the project was awarded to Carroll County Youth Service Bureau

### **Performance Measures- Programs funded and monitored by LMB**

#### **Adventure Diversion Program (ADP)**

- 27 youth were served in ADP
- 128 evening reporting sessions held
- 117 venturing activities conducted
- 10 weekend venturing activities conducted
- 100% of youth exhibited a desired change in targeted behaviors
- 100% of youth were fully assessed
- 100% of cases were assigned to alternatives to detention programs

#### **Parents As Teachers Initiative (PAT)**

- 449 children served in PAT
- 317 families served in PAT
- PAT reached out to those most in need: 71% low income, 32% low educational attainment, 17% child with disability or chronic health conditions and 13% parent with a mental illness.
- 95 mental health consultations were made for behavioral/social-emotional concerns
- 98% of parents surveyed were satisfied or more than satisfied with PAT services
- 100% of parents benefited from PAT services as demonstrated by pre and post test

#### **Parent – Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT)**

- 42 parent-child dyads received PCIT.
- Referrals came from Department of Social Services, Parents As Teachers and other community agencies
- 100% of the children did not have Child Protective Service involvement 12 months post treatment

**Brief Strategic Family Therapy (BSFT)**

- 57 families served
- 229 individuals served
- 100% of parents/guardians were satisfied with BSFT
- Families demonstrated healthy approaches to resolve problems. Positive changes were seen in family roles, verbal communication and solving problems as measured by McMaster Family Assessment.

**Get Connected Family Resource Center (GCFRC)**

- 1,175 calls received
- 4,066 referrals made
- 10,473 web site hits
- 847 families served by Family Navigators
- 100% of families were satisfied with services from Family Navigators
- 100% of families report success in receiving needed services
- 100% of families report an increase in ability to advocate for their child's needs
- 100% of families reported a decrease in stress after receiving family navigation services

**Cultural Navigator (CN)**

- 529 individuals were served and 310 referrals for services were made
- 14 community events outreached to another 1,008 individuals
- 100% of individuals were satisfied with Cultural Navigator
- 100% of individuals reported that the referrals provided the requested information or service
- 100% of individuals reported increase confidence & competence in addressing future needs

**Interagency Family Preservation (IFP)**

- 21 families served
- 100% of families made positive change in least one domain as measured by North Carolina Family Assessment Scale. Greatest change came in parent capability (88.9%) and family interaction (77.8%)
- 100% of families were satisfied or more than satisfied with services
