Lineboro Volunteer Fire Department Presents 21th Annual Haunted Hayride and House of Horror

“Bedlam in the Boro” is a haunted attraction that consists of a hayride and the House of Horror. This year’s hayride is going to be better than ever. Packed with monsters, special effects and spine-tingling stunts sure to scare the living daylights out of you. While you travel over three miles through the historic winding back lanes of our town, some of the darkest, dreariest and scariest parts, where ghosts and ghouls are on the prowl, you will encounter many new surprises along the way, as well as some of your old favorites. See if you can make it past the Chain Saw Massacre. Make sure you keep your arms and legs in the wagon as Dr. Frankenstein may be looking for spare parts. And die laughing as you pass the Killer Clowns.

The ride is perfect for teens and adults but may not be suitable for younger children. The ride begins and ends at the fire station, travels over three miles, and provides families an action-packed night out with nearly Thirty minutes of enjoyment on the hayride alone. During the ride, our tractor drawn wagons pass several terrifying skits, designed, built, and staffed entirely by volunteers. There will be live entertainment and carnival games to enjoy while waiting your turn on the ride; or you can check it out if you make it back.

And while you are here, don’t miss the new and improved House of Horror. Experience hair-raising chills and thrills as you make your way through over 3,200 square feet of tantalizing terror. Watch Dr. Miscut do the Ultimate Makeover, beware of the Junkyard Dog and hold onto your vertigo while going through the spinning vortex.

If you think that our haunted hayride may be too scary for your young children, come out on Sunday, October 18th and 25th from 2-4 p.m. for the Bedlam Bypass, a non-haunted hayride for kids of all ages, where you will receive a trip to the local pumpkin patch and each child receives a free pumpkin.

This year’s 8-night event covers four weekends in October. Again available this year will be R.I.P. Passes-go to the front of the line with no wait at each attraction. Hours for ticket sales for these attractions are Fridays and Saturdays 7:00 p.m. until 10:30 p.m. Both attractions stay open until the last person is through.

Traffic may be slowed along Main St, S Church St, and Alesia-Lineboro Rd, due to tractors and wagons entering and exiting the roadway. Fire police will be stationed at key intersections along Main St. to help with pedestrian safety and wagons entering the roadway. There will be road closed signs at the intersections of York Rd #1 and Alesia-Lineboro Rd, York Rd #1 and Kern Rd, Baughman Mill Rd and York Rd #1, and N Mill St and Main St. Those roadways will be closed to non-residential traffic during the hours of 7:00 p.m. - 11:30 p.m.
