“Keymar burglars confronted by pub owner and deputy; arrested”

Keymar, Carroll County, Maryland, June 5, 2009 ---- Three Frederick men were arrested by Sheriff's deputies early this morning as they attempted to burglarize the Crossroads Inn on Middleburg Road near the Frederick-Carroll County line. At approximately 1:00 am, Sheriff's Deputies responded to a report from the Inn's owner, who had noticed an unfamiliar truck slowly circle the business as he left for the night. Returning to the Inn to investigate, the owner stopped a man who emerged from behind the building.

Nearby Sheriff's deputies quickly arrived and identified the man as 24-year-old Robert Joseph Roskowinski. During further investigation of the Inn, Deputy 1st Class Mark Devilbiss encountered a second man near a rear gate leading into the business; he was identified as Christopher Todd Correll aged 19. A pry bar was discovered lying on the ground where Correll had been standing, and the hinges to an adjacent gate were found pried open and broken from the post to enable access into the fenced area and rear of the Inn.

As deputies took the two men into custody, the truck returned to the Inn's parking lot. The truck's operator, Kevin Wayne Fout aged 21 told deputies that he had come to pick-up a friend, whom he identified as Roskowinski. During a search subsequent to his arrest, Correll was also discovered to be in possession of gloves and a screwdriver. Consequently, all three men were charged with Burglary, and Conspiracy to commit Burglary. In addition, Correll was charged with Possession of Burglar Tools and Malicious Destruction of Property.

All three men are currently being held at the Carroll County Detention Center while awaiting a bail review hearing before the District Court Commissioner. The Sheriff's Office investigation continues; additional charges are pending...
