“Suspects arrested for Manchester Burglaries”

Manchester, Carroll County, Maryland, October 20, 2009 ---- [Anthony William-Boxcar McFarland](#) aged 18 of no fixed address was arrested on October 13, 2009 for the burglary of the Manchester Pharmacy located at 3321 North Main Street in Manchester, Maryland. Deputies responding to an alarm at the pharmacy noted that the side window had been broken and observed prescription bottles containing assorted medications strewn about the parking lot of the business. Upon review of the stores video surveillance system a suspect was seen entering the business and stealing several bags of prescription medication with an estimated value exceeding \$5000.00. A responding Deputy knew McFarland due to a prior encounter and was able to positively identify the suspect. McFarland was later located at a residence in Manchester and taken into custody by Detective's from the Carroll County Sheriff's Office. McFarland was transported to the Carroll County Detention Center where he was charged with several Criminal Law violations, including burglary, trespassing, malicious destruction of property, and theft.

In an unrelated incident, [Pennie Ann Maynard](#) aged 51 of Manchester was arrested on October 12th, 2009 for the burglary of her landlord's residence located in the 3700 block of Schalk Road in Manchester, Maryland. On October 12, 2009 the landlord/victim reviewed her video surveillance system and observed the suspect enter her home without permission, remove money, and exit the dwelling. The victim positively identified the suspect as her tenant. The victim installed the video surveillance system after being burglarized on three separate occasions during the months of July, August, and September during which varying quantities of United States currency were also stolen. The victim elected not to contact Sheriff's Deputies to report the earlier crimes. Suspect Maynard was located by Sheriff's Office personnel and following an interview by Detectives confessed to all of the burglaries and surrendered the money taken in the most recent crime. Consequently, Suspect Pennie Maynard was transported to the Carroll County Detention Center and charged with several Criminal Law violations, including burglary, trespassing, and theft.

Both Maynard and McFarland were released on bond following a bail review before the District Court Commissioner.
